Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1

The institution follows the curriculum framed by the Board of Studies of the University. Apart from regular classes, tutorial or extra classes are taken for enhancing the knowledge of students. The curriculum delivery is effectively done through lectures and online classes through MOODLE by supplying study materials and through departmental WhatsApp groups and power point presentations. Student's quiz, debates, group discussions, paper presentations, educational tours, field trips, inter disciplinary competitions, national and state seminars are also organised by the institution. Departments periodically reviews the syllabus and student's progression through departmental meetings. For the further progression of students, the college library conducted career guidance programme. Feedback from students are regularly collected to strengthen further curriculum development. The collected feedback should be analyzed and remedial action should be taken if there is any suggestions from the stakeholders like students, teachers, employers and parents

This college is affiliated to Manipur University, it adheres to the academic calendar for conducting an internal evaluation system. Accordingly, the academic calendar includes information regarding the commencement of the examination, schedules of internal examinations, the date of the term-end examinations etc. The faculty prepares teaching plans by proper distribution of syllabus according to the academic calendar. The internal examination is conducted every year before University examinations.

The institution runs the courses in Arts, Commerce and Science stream with nineteen subjects and vocational courses approved by UGC. The curriculum is designed by the University which includes various topics covering cross-cutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human values and Professional Ethics. The integration of cross cutting issues made more specific and addressing it to the local needs. The institution is encouraging the students to undertake more number of experimental learning through project works/field trips/ internships etc. The institution should offer more number of add on courses, value added courses to ensure the participation of maximum number of students.

Qualitative analysis of Criterion 2

The college takes necessary steps to understand the needs and requirements of the students before the commencement of the degree programs. The College organizes induction programs for the newly admitted students where they are counselled, advised, and guided well about the courses, mode of assessment as well as facilities available in college. Special care is given to the under-privileged students by providing them the study materials through the WhatsApp groups. They are also allowed to read subject-related reference books in the departmental library etc. The college adopted a mentoring process for monitoring the attendance, punctuality, discipline and academic performance as well as to guide them through their lifelong learning and job-seeking path.

Various activity-based techniques are adopted by the faculty members to make the teaching-learning system as student-centric. The different kinds of activities conducted in the college to enhance students' skill to adopt participative learning within and outside the college. Teachers are using Information Communication Technology (ICT) for an effective teaching-learning process. IQAC organizes faculty development programs to train the teachers on how to use Information Communication and Technology as a method of teaching. The teachers are using the MOODLE platform for teaching and learning of the subject contents, assignments etc.

The institution follows the rules and regulations set by Manipur University for colleges and conducts internal assessments for every semester. The students get information about the assessment system at both college-level and University levels from the beginning of every academic year. The college Examination Committee and Educational Technological Cell are assigned by the head of the institution to supervise the smooth conduct of the internal assessment examinations. The internal examination-related grievances are taken care by the

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institution through a transparent and a time-bound process.

The college follows outcome-based education. Course outcomes (Cos) are defined for all the courses in the curriculum by each department. The POs, PSOs, and Cos are disseminated to all the stakeholders through various means. The POs and PSOs are displayed on Institute's Website. The college evaluates the attainment of program outcomes, program-specific outcomes and course outcomes by a structured and innovative methods. The syllabus contents are taught and examinations at various levels are conducted and on the basis of the results, the rank holders are felicitated at the university and college.

Qualitative analysis of Criterion 3

The receipts of grants for conducting research work are very limited. The institution should focus more upon organizing international/national conferences and workshops particularly on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Research Methodology and Entrepreneurship Development. The number of teachers with Doctoral Degree is twenty two (30% approx). Appropriate steps should be taken by the institution to encourage teachers to increase the number of Doctoral Degrees. Faculty members shall also be encouraged to participate in academic conferences outside and publish more articles in referred journals and book chapters.

The institution organizes a number of extension activities to promote neighborhood community by sensitizing the students towards community development. The college organizes various extension activities inside and outside the college campus and in the surrounding villages through NSS, YRC, Environmental Awareness Committee, Women's Cell Committee and Red Ribbon Club. The activities includes Plantation of tree saplings and eco-awareness activities, No Plastic zone, Fit India Campaign, World Tobacco Day, Teachers Day, National Cleanliness Day, Rabot Day, World Health Day Awareness Programmes, Blood donation camps, the distribution of masks, hand sanitizer and essential commodities. The College has three NSS Units and they adopted three villages in the surrounding area. However, the participation of students in extension activities is an issue to be addressed by the institution. More number of students are participating in extension related activities organized by the college. The introduction of ED Club, Innovation and Start up activities should be included in order to develop the entrepreneurial and innovative talents of the students. The institution is trying to receive more number of awards and recognitions from government/ government recognized bodies for the extension activities. The institution should focus upon creating collaborations with national and international institutions, universities, industries, corporate houses etc in the areas like academics, research and placements.

Qualitative analysis of Criterion 4

The institution has good infrastructural facilities spread over 15 acres of land with 13289.12 sq.ms built up area with 25 classrooms, 11 laboratories, 1 multipurpose hall, a gymnasium and one auditorium. The classrooms are equipped with minimum required furniture, blackboard, white board and fans. The laboratories are constantly upgraded with the latest instruments and apparatus. The laboratories are well ventilated and care is taken to ensure proper safety measures while performing the practical classes. The college has a multipurpose Hall which is constantly used for academic functions, state and national conferences, cultural programmes and interactive sessions

The college library is built on an area of 348.39 sq. m. and is a repository of different kinds of reading materials. The library has 12174 textbooks and 525 reference books. The Library is an N-LIST subscriber and has access to 3 lakhs eBooks and 6000 journals. All the staff and students have access to vast e-resources available under N-LIST of NMEICT. The automation process of the college library is undergoing by using open source software 'KOHA – 21.05 version'. Besides the Central Library, all the 19 departments have departmental libraries and book collections for the students .

A Biotech Hub exist in the College which aims to provide basic Biotechnology infrastructure and research facility to the students and faculty.

The whole campus of the college is Wi-Fi enabled. The College has altogether 70 computers, 15 printers and 4 LCD projectors with accessories. The facility available is not adequate as compared to the student's ratio.

Swimming pool, Girls' Hostel, Students' Common Room, Cycle / vehicle shed, CCTV Surveillance, Women's Cell, 3 ladys' toilets, 3 gents' toilets, Chowkidar quarters and a high-power generator shed are also available. Facilities like Gymnasium, Basket Ball Court, Playground, Yoga events are available in the college campus.

The college has an IT policy that addresses various aspects of management for effective implementation of its programs towards realizing the institutional mission objectives. There are different committees like Library

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Committee, **research development committee**, College Development Committee, College Beautification Committee, Hostel Committee, and Environmental Awareness Committee to look after the different infrastructural aspects of the college.

Qualitative analysis of Criterion 5

The students benefitted by scholarships and free ships provided by the institution, Government and non-government bodies, industries, individuals, philanthropists are very less and efforts shall be made by the institution to improve the number of beneficiaries. More activities to be organized by the institution to improve the soft skills, language and communication skills, life skills and ICT Computing skills of the students. Also the institution should focus upon organizing effective and systematic guidance for competitive exams and career counselling initiatives for the benefit of more number of students. The institution should encourage the students to enroll for higher education by offering them necessary career counselling programmes.

According to the norms and established process of the University and Directorate of Higher Education, there is a student union by conducting students' election in every academic session. The duties and responsibilities of the elected secretaries of the students' union act as the executives of any affairs with regard to development of the college such as academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities during their tenure. They are actively involved in almost every activity conducted and organised by the college.

The college has a registered alumni association and they are associated with active participation in the developmental work of the college. The former students of the college constituted a registered association named as "Biramangol College Alumni Association". The Alumni Association is constantly working for the well-being and development of the college. The alumni members have contributed different assets like drinking water containers, dustbins, some repairing work of the class rooms and also the financial assistance of Rs.4000/- each to the differentially abled four students of the college. They have also organized voluntarily the mass social work programs and for the career development of student community. Other departments have also extended their support to the economically backward students of the college.

Qualitative analysis of Criterion 6

Biramangol College located in semi urban area, is the only higher education academic institution in the North Eastern Side of Manipur to impart quality education to the economically and socially backward rural students . The College has set its own vision and mission to achieve the desired level in respect of academic, co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities.

The College has a perspective plan in place to help it to develop in a systematic, well planned and phased manner. The teachers of the college actively participate in various decision-making bodies for the smooth functioning of the academic activities. It immensely helps in the progress of the college in many fronts. All teachers discharge their roles and responsibilities towards the implementation of the vision and mission of the college and involved in the decision-making processes.

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The College practices decentralization and participatory management system. There are extensive delegation of authority to the heads of the various departments in the college to carry out the academic and administrative activities of the college. The Principal, Vice Principal, IQAC Coordinator and all other faculty members are effectively delegating their duty to offer quality education and facilities to the students and local community. The College continuously makes efforts to enhance and enrich the welfare of its teaching and non-teaching staff.

The College has established a mechanism for conducting both external and internal audits on the financial transactions year-wise to ensure financial compliance. The college finds its means of generating income from the college facilities through the college canteen, gymnasium, and swimming pool. The mobilized funds are utilized for the development purpose of the college.

The IQAC functions on the basis of the guidelines set forth by NAAC. The following two practices institutionalized by IQAC are the maintenance of the college files and mentor-mentee system is implemented for the students of the College.

Qualitative analysis of Criterion 7

The College provides equal opportunities to all the stakeholders irrespective of gender, race, caste, creed, language, religion, nationality or other status. Safety, security and well-being along with gender equity and a

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friendly working atmosphere are also taken care of the institution. The college has installed CCTV cameras for surveillances.

Anti-Ragging Committee members ensures that the campus is free of ragging. Girl students are periodically counselled on safety and security by the Women's Cell Committee members and also by the faculty mentors. Girls Common Room and Women's Cell Room are available for the girls' students provided with necessary facilities such as Sanitary Vending Machine and incinerator machine, first aid box, bed, mirror, chair, table, dustbin, carom board, chess etc.

"Use and Throw" items like plastic cups, plates etc. used in the college canteen are replaced by reusable steel glasses and plates. Glass, paper and metal waste are sold for recycle. Food waste and non-biodegradable waste are collected in separate bins. Biodegradable waste is disposed in the waste pit along with cow dung for decomposition and to be used as manure. Non-biodegradable waste is handed to the waste collecting van of the non-government agency for further treatment. Wastewater generated from the laboratories are very small in quantity and they are handled along with septic sewage. E-wastes like electronic devices and condemned batteries which are disposed through outside agencies and are also given to authorized dealers who purchase the scrap and reuse the useful components.

The college has organized and conducted several activities to build an environment for ethical, cultural, and spiritual values among the students and staff. The college students and faculty jointly celebrate the cultural and regional festivals and functions like Freshers' Meet, Teachers' Day, Farewell Program, Induction program, International Women's Day, Van Mahotsav, Yoga Day, Fit India Run, Lamyamba Hijam Irabot Day, New Year Celebration and also religious ritual activities such as Tarpon (paying tribute to the departed souls), College Foundation Day, College Diety Day of Ibudhou-Ibendhou Phijol Hongba etc. The Students' Union Pillar with the motto "One for All, All for One" was erected in the campus to promote unity in diversity.

The college has formulated policies to reflect core values and rules of code of conduct for students and staff members. The College has organized various academic and co-curricular activities for better understanding of the fundamental duties and rights of Indian citizens. The college observes and organizes national and international commemorative days, events and festivals.

The institution has successfully implemented their best practices like empowering women through gender neutral atmosphere, education beyond the classrooms. Recognizing its identified position as a premier institute, the college makes consistent efforts in fulfilling its social responsibility toward the under privileged sections of society. The college authority, staffs and students adopted three villages under Lamlai Assembly Constituency with the objective to uplift the Health Care & Education of the villagers for their development and welfare.
