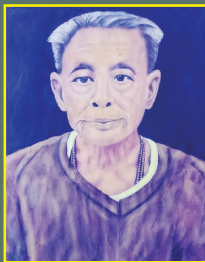

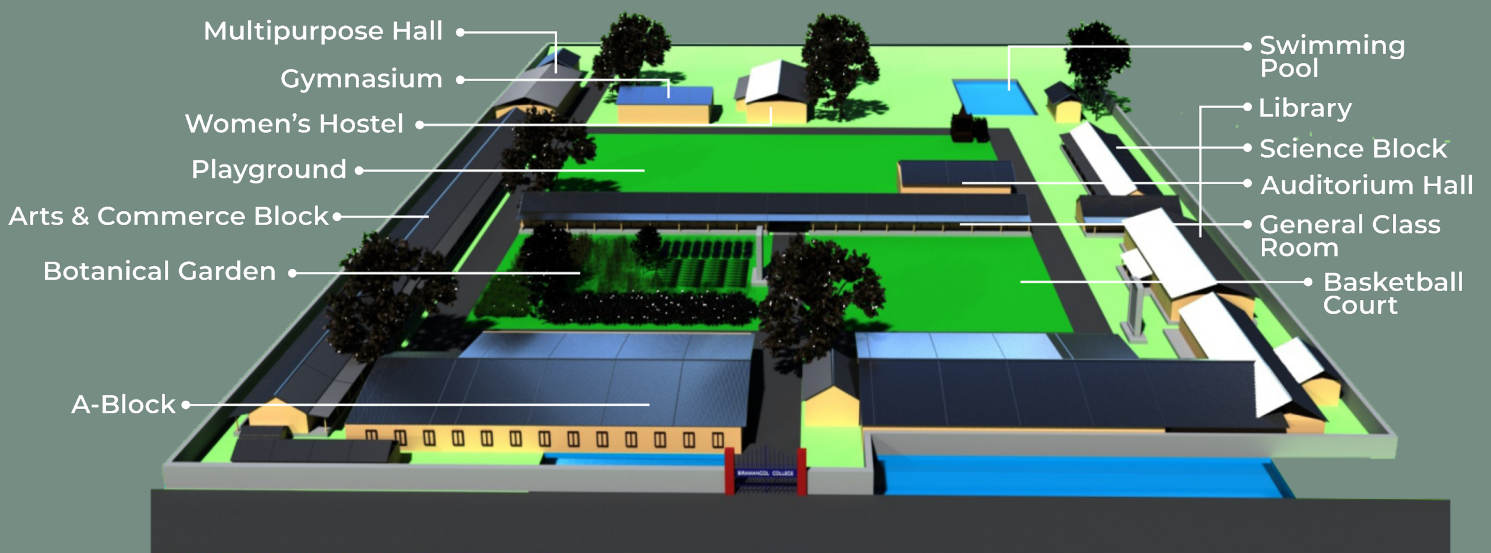

## BIRAMANGOL COLLEGE - PROFILE AT A GLANCE

**B**iramangol College was established on 21st January 1973 through the dedicated efforts of the local villagers, with a vision to provide higher education in this educationally and economically backward region.

The College is situated at Sawombung (Lamlai Assembly Constituency), about 11 km from Imphal, along the Imphal-Ukhrul Road (NH-150).

### Government Status

Initially aided, Biramangol College was granted recurring Grant-in-Aid by the State Government in 1980 (vide Order No. 01-07-1979 dated 30-07-1980). It was later converted into a full-fledged Government College on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2019, vide Government Order No. 31/3/AIDED-COL/CONVSN/HE-16 dated 22/02/2019.

### Affiliation

The College was affiliated to Guwahati University until 1980. From 1981, it came under the affiliation of Manipur University (vide Order No. MU/3-13/81(II)/3444-47, dated 10-08-1981) for Arts and Science streams. In 1992, it received permanent affiliation as a full-fledged Degree College in Arts, Science, and Commerce under Manipur University (vide Order No. MU2-1/80/CDC dated 27-03-1992).

### UGC Recognition

Biramangol College is recognized under Sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956 No.F.8-9/91(CPP-1) dated 22/04/1994 making it eligible for central grants and assistance.

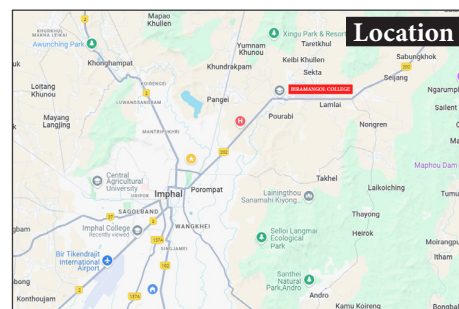
### Campus and Land

### Scope and Coverage

- NEP 2020 ordinance shall supersede the existing Ordinance for Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science (Six-Semester System), 2010.
- The undergraduate academic programme governed by this Ordinance shall be of four years duration with multiple exit options within this period with appropriate certifications namely,
  - (a) Bachelor's Certificate in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the First Year (Two Semesters);
  - (b) Bachelor's Diploma in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the Second Year (Four Semesters);
  - (c) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline at the successful completion of the Third Year (Six Semesters);
  - (d) Bachelor's Degree with Honours in a Discipline at the successful completion of the Four Year (Eight Semesters).
- This Ordinance shall be applicable to the students taking admission to the undergraduate programmes from the Academic Session 2021-2022.
- Those students who were admitted to the undergraduate programmes before enforcement of this

Ordinance shall continue to be governed by the existing Ordinance for Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Science (Six-Semester System), 2010.

- The curriculum for the 4-year undergraduate programme shall be based on the LOCF-CBCS system of the UGC with value addition courses which are envisaged in the NEP 2020.

### **Course Curriculum and Syllabus**

- The course curriculum and syllabus of every undergraduate programme shall be developed by the concerned School Board of Studies/ Department Board of Studies / Board of Under-Graduate Studies of Manipur University and they shall be implemented after obtaining approval from the Academic Council.
- The University may offer a number of choices for the papers under Generic Elective Courses (GEC), Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses, Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and Value Addition Courses (VAC), as per the availability of the courses and faculty.
- The University may evolve a system/ policy about Extra Curricular Activities/ General Interest and Hobby Courses/Sports/ NCC/ NSS/Vocational courses/ related courses, for adding them under Value Addition Courses (VAC).
- Dissertation/ Project Work/ Internship is optional and it may be offered in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper in 8th Semester.
- Every course/ paper offered in the University shall have a unique Course Code consisting of 05 (five) alphanumeric characters in the form of “XYpqr” where the double alphabet characters “XY” shall identify the discipline/ subject to which the Course/ paper belongs, p is a numeric character specifying the qualification level and “qr” are numeric characters specifying the serial number of the Course/ paper under that level.
- The curriculum of every undergraduate programme shall be in conformity with the University Grants Commission’s Guidelines for the Learning Outcomes-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS).
- Every undergraduate programme shall conform to the common minimum curriculum and syllabi of the core papers as fixed by the UGC under the CBCS system. The allowed deviation from the syllabi is 30% at the maximum.

### **Value Addition Courses (VAC)**

These are courses that will help develop all capacities of human beings - intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner. It includes subjects like Yoga, Sports, Health Care, NCC, NSS, Ethics, and Culture etc. VAC courses may be chosen from a pool of courses. Each VAC course shall carry 2 Credits.

**2. Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit Options and Certifications.**

In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC), Manipur University and its affiliated colleges shall implement the Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit (MEME) scheme in their undergraduate programmes. This flexible framework allows students to enter, exit, and re-enter the programme at designated stages, with each stage linked to a corresponding academic certification, as per the prescribed credit requirements:

A student enrolled in the Four-Year UG Programme, as per the existing ordinance, shall be eligible for the following certifications based on the point of exit or upon successful completion, whichever is applicable

**2.1. Bachelor's Certificate:** Students who choose to exit after the successful completion of the first year and have earned a minimum of 40 credits shall be awarded a UG Certificate, provided they also complete a vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation following the first year. Such students may re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years.

**2.2. Bachelor's Diploma:** Students who choose to exit after the successful completion of the second year and have earned a minimum of 80 credits (40 from 1<sup>st</sup> Year and 40 from 2<sup>nd</sup> year) shall be awarded a UG Diploma, provided they also complete a vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation following the second year. Re-entry into the programme shall be permitted within three years.

**2.3. Three-Year Bachelor's Degree:** Students who complete three years of study, earn a minimum of 120 credits, and meet the minimum credit requirements in the major discipline shall be awarded a UG Degree in the respective major upon exit.

**2.4. Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours):** A Four-Year UG Honours Degree in the major discipline shall be awarded to students who complete four years of study, earn a minimum of 160 credits, and fulfill the prescribed credit requirements. Students who do not undertake a research project/

dissertation must complete three additional theory courses totaling 12 credits in lieu of the research component.

**2.5. Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research):** Students who secure 7.5 CGPA over the previous six semesters and choose to pursue research in the fourth year shall undertake a research project or dissertation under the supervision of a faculty member of the College. The research work must be within the major discipline. Students who complete 160 credits, including 12 credits from the research project/dissertation, shall be awarded a UG Degree (Honours with Research).

**2.6. UG Programme with Single Major:** To be awarded a Bachelor's Degree with a single major, a student must earn at least 50% of the total required credits from the major discipline.

- For a 3-year UG programme (120 credits), a minimum of 60 credits must be from the major discipline.
- For a 4-year UG programme (160 credits), a minimum of 80 credits must be from the major discipline.

For example, a student of Physics earning the required minimum credits in the major will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Physics (Honours or Honours with Research, as applicable) with a single major.

**Illustration 1:** The following illustration outlines the certification a student may receive based on the credit requirements fulfilled in different subjects during the programme duration.

### Marks Distribution and Evaluation

Total marks for each course shall be based on internal assessment (25%) and semester end examination (75%). The internal assessment of 25% shall be distributed as under:

- Test/ Assignment/Seminar/ Field Work/Project Work/Case Study: 20%;
- Attendance: 5%.
